Activities: It seems that the Zenith Women's Institute depended on Mrs. Hosegood's presence, since it folded when she left the community. She "stayed there as a member for two years. (She laughingly told us that she wasn't qualified to organize such a group as she had never belonged to one before.) Wherever she went, during her teaching career, she was a member of a W.I. if there was one within travelling distance." She joined the Rugby WI in 1934.
